
My Place in this World





Where do I live?

We will observe the season of Autumn!
We will look for signs of Autumn on



How does Newcastle compare to **Broken Hill, Australia?**

We will learn how to identify key features of human and physical geography using maps and aerial photogrape. We will compare and contrast Newcastle with another Non-European location.



Where in the world can transport

take us?

We will learn about the physical and human features of our local area and how they can be crossed by different forms of transport. We will study the geography of our local area, creating our own maps, using symbols and a key. We will learn to name and recognise the continents, oceans and countries of the UK.

We will use maps and photographs to discover human and physical features of the United Kingdom; we will name and locate capital cities within the UK and use globes and atlases to learn about the Commonwealth.

Where did people live

in prehistory?

We will think about where the best place to build early settlements might be and why; considering the distribution of natural resources including energy, food, minerals and water. We will locate ancient sites using a range of maps including OS & digital and identify features on aerial photographs.



What did Roman Britain look like.

compared to now?

We will look at the extent of the Roman Empire. We will compare maps of Roman Britain to modern maps and look for clues that the Romans were here. We will look at aerial maps of our area and identify the key features that encouraged and facilitated settlement



Which places were good to build

a coastal defence?

We will find out where the Anglo Saxons and Scots came from. We will look at the key physical features of our local area and think about why invaders chose to settle here. We will learn that many British place names are derived from Anglo-Saxon words and label places on maps.










What is a Climate

Activist?

We will celebrate International Women's Day (7th March) and learn about climate activism, including Greta Thunberg and the 'Fridays for Future' movement. We will look at the impact that climate change is having on our planet and the need to drive change. We will work towards our Eco-Schools' Green Flag award.



How has the town of Whitley Bay

changed?

We will investigate what brings people to Whitley Bay; identifying and recording human and physical characteristics and focussing on land-use patterns, as well as the regeneration of our local area, particularly in relation to leisure. We will visit 'The Jam Jar', a local independent cinema in Whitley Bay and find out how the location and distribution of cinemas in our area has changed over time.
